Dear Families.

Yesterday, July 26th, is the day the Church remembers St. Joachim and St. Anne, the parents of the Virgin Mary. Despite the importance of their role as the maternal grandparents of Jesus, we do not know too much about them. Regarding Joachim, we know that he was a shepherd from Jerusalem, married to Anne. They did not have any children, and they were a rather elderly couple when, one day, while Joachim was at work in the fields as usual, an angel appeared to announce the birth of a child, and Anna also had the same vision. So they called their little girl Mary, which means "loved by God," and then they moved to Nazareth, where they educated Mary, teaching her the law of the Lord. Yesterday allowed us the opportunity to remember our Grandparents, whether they are living or are no longer with us. I know my grandparents loved me very much and all of them gave so much help to my parents, and in turn my parents and my wife's parents have given us so much support. We would have celebrated our grandparents at Mass next week – we will need to remember them and thank them over the phone and continue to pray for them.

As you may have heard, or seen in the media, there have been recently confirmed COVID case associated with nearby schools. The advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer is that it is safe for your students and families to continue attending school under current arrangements. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has assured that any other schools potentially impacted would be contacted by them directly and advised accordingly. DHHS is currently undertaking contact tracing in relation to these recent cases nearby. They will contact any member of our school community that has had close contact with a confirmed case. Please note that at this stage, DHHS has not been in contact with St Paul's.

Our school continues to work closely with the DHHS and Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM) to ensure our practices reflect current advice and support the safety and wellbeing of our school community. We are undertaking significant extra school cleaning measures and hand hygiene continues to be a priority. It is also important that we all continue to monitor our own and the health of our children. If you or your child develops any symptoms, stay at home, seek medical advice and call the school to let us know. Please remember to wear a mask any time you leave your home.

A reminder that any levies that have been charged for Extra Curricular activities will be credited back to your family accounts should we have to cancel programs because of COVID-19. For example, if the MMA Camps or SMA camps do not proceed, we will credit your accounts the amount for the camps. More information about this will follow next term when we know whether we can reschedule events or activities that families have been charged for.

If you have not enrolled your child in Prep for 2021, please do so immediately. Please complete an enrolment form and return it to the office as soon as possible.

# WHEN YOU ALL NEED A BREAK FROM ONLINE LEARNING HEAD OUTDOORS...

A noticing nature walk is about observing the environment with all senses.

- All you need is somewhere to walk.
- Going at your child's pace and asking questions can encourage your child to notice things.

# A 'noticing' nature walk: why it's good for children

Going on a nature walk and deliberately noticing things encourages children to observe with all their senses. Children can learn to focus their attention and take in the details of things around them. It can be a peaceful, reflective experience for you and your children.

### What you need for a noticing nature walk

All you need is somewhere to walk. You can:

- walk around your local area if you live near the bush
- go to a local park or nature reserve

#### How to do a noticing nature walk

Walk with your child, at your child's pace. Encourage your child to pay attention to the environment with all their senses. You can do this by asking questions as you go. For example:

- **Seeing questions:** what can you see? Look all around you, up at the sky and down at the ground.
- **Smelling questions:** what can you smell? Can you describe the smell? Leafy? Like mud?
- **Hearing questions:** what can you hear? Birds? The wind? Other people?
- Feeling and touching questions: what can you feel? Is the sun warm? Is the ground rough or smooth?

You can collect small items, if you're allowed to, like leaves, pebbles and feathers. Talk about them – for example, 'What kind of bird do you think this came from?' and 'What a pretty pattern on that leaf!'. Take as long as your child wants. You don't have to finish the walk if something catches your child's interest along the way. Let the walk be about connecting with the environment and enjoying time together, rather than getting to the end.

When you get home, make some time for your child to reflect on the walk. Your child could draw pictures of it, write a story about it, or perhaps <u>make a collage</u> with leaves and feathers.

#### Adapting a noticing nature walk for children of different ages

You can adapt this activity to your child's age in the way you talk, the questions you ask, how far you walk and how fast or slow you go.
