'Bullying is when someone, or a group of people, deliberately upset or hurt another person or damage their property, reputation or social acceptance on more than one occasion. OUR VOICE BECOMES THEIR INNER VOICE

Our voice becomes their inner voice. What does this mean? It means that our children really listen to and internalise the things that we say.

And the truth is...when things are super busy we fall into a trap of noticing only what our children do **wrong**. We might say things like, "C'mon, why are you so slow? We're running late!" And when things are going as expected (your child dresses up on time for school), we usually don't give it proper attention.

It's incredibly important, however, that we notice our children being good. Positive reinforcement from us directly contributes to our children's positive self-talk. Here are some examples of how what we can say when we catch our child being good.
