If we do return to school on Friday, I am sure there will be restrictions that we need to follow – I will forward you correspondence as soon as possible so that we are all aware of what is required to keep all in our community safe.

A reminder that you must book your child's Learning Conversation by this Thursday 10th June at 4.00pm. If you have not booked a time by Thursday afternoon, you will be allocated a time. At this time, we are unsure if the conversations will be in person or online/via phone. As soon as we know what we are allowed to do, we will let you know. However, the interviews will proceed in some format. Go to www.schoolinterviews.com.au, enter the code *tupsk* and press "Go" if you haven't already booked a time. Please remember that your child's school report will be sent home with your child on Tuesday, 15th June.

If you have not enrolled your child in Prep for 2022, **please do so immediately.** If you have not submitted an application as yet, your child may be put on a waiting list. Due to the lockdown, the dates of all interviews for our 2022 Prep families have been changed. You will receive an email advising you of the new date for your 2022 Prep Interview.

Our Writing Professional Development Activity will be held on Thursday 29th July – there will be no school for students on this day. There is no school for children on Monday, 14th June as it is the Queen's Birthday Public Holiday.

Term II concludes on Friday 25th June at 1.00pm. The children are able to wear plain clothes as it is the last day of term. After School Care will operate from 1.00pm until 6.00pm on this day. Term III commences on Monday 12th July at 8.40am.

SeeSaw Class app for Students

If you have the **SeeSaw class** app, the students can log in with their unique code that was already provided. If you don't have the app, you can access the class by going to https://web.seesaw.me/ on the internet (e.g. using Chrome, Safari, Internet Explorer, Firefox) and clicking on 'Log In', click on 'I am a Student' and then enter your provided code (remember the spaces in the correct places!). Please note this code is a password to get access to the student's account. Therefore, please keep this code in a safe place and do not post such codes on social media or in any

publicly accessible place on the Internet.

Google Meets

Google Meets will allow all students and classroom teachers to meet online to help connect with each other. Class teachers will advise the time of the Meets and the access codes via SeeSaw. Attached are the instructions of how to log into Google Meet.

Phone Calls

Learning Support Officers (LSOs) will be making contact via phone calls with some children/families to assist students with their remote learning tasks. These could be reading, writing, maths or production related activities. We hope this will help the children feel more confident to complete remote learning activities.



ONLINE LEARNING TIPS

Thank you to all our families for your support during these unprecedented times of online learning. Managing our time and supporting our children is a real challenge and there isn't necessarily a right or wrong way of doing things. But in order to manage our wellbeing during these times, here's 5 tips to help manage the technology side of you children's learning.

- **Tip 1: Supervision** We strongly encourage all children to use their devices in a shared space rather than being in a bedroom unsupervised.
- **Tip 2: Social Media** A reminder that most social media sites, such as Tik Tok, Snapchat, Facebook and Instagram have an age restriction of 13 years and over.
- **Tip 3: Clear expectations** Remember that you have the right to set restrictions in terms of screen time and to structure your day at home to suit your needs.
- **Tip 4: Screen Time** We strongly encourage all children to balance screen time with activities that don't involve a digital device. A ball game or reading a book are all great ways to show kids how they can learn and enjoy themselves without a mobile, tablet or computer and can help managing your day.
- **Tip 5: Charging Devices** make sure all devices are put away each night and are charged for learning the following day.

How to Educate Your Child in Your Daily Life

Children tend to do the same thing that their parents do, so by showing that they value education and use it in their daily lives, parents provide a model which can help children develop positive attitudes towards learning and to build confidence in themselves as learners. Here are some ideas:

- When you are travelling somewhere with your child, talk about things that you see, such as funny signs, cars, or people you see.
- When you are shopping with your child, talk to your child about prices, different brands, or how to pick good fruit and vegetables. Teach them how to politely request and pay for items from the shopkeeper.
- As you make dinner, talk to your child about how to follow steps in a recipe and what happens otherwise.
- As you fix or repair something, ask your child to pass you the tools, show them what you are doing and tell them why you are doing it.
- As you watch TV together, encourage your child to tell you about the program, the characters, who s/he likes and why, and what s/he predicts will happen next. They will get more out of the experience.
