Dear Families,

Yesterday at his daily press conference, Premier Daniel Andrews stated that restrictions would most likely not ease at 11.59pm on Thursday, 2nd September as we had hoped. Because of this, we will be unable to hold our Father's Day Stall on Friday. This is very disappointing, as I know the children look forward to it each year. Depending on announcements made over the next few days, there could be other events that we need to cancel. We will keep you informed of any other changes.

Once we hear confirmation from the Government about when this lockdown will end, and if there are any restrictions on crowds at events, we will make a decision about the production 'Aladdin'.

I thank you for all you are doing at this most difficult time to support your family. I hope that with continued vaccinations, lockdowns will be a thing of the past and we can live with limited restrictions. If you haven't been vaccinated, I encourage you to seek medical advice and then make an informed decision about whether or not to be vaccinated.

National Child Protection Week (NCPW) begins on Father's Day each year – this year it takes place from 5-11 September. The enduring message of National Child Protection Week is that 'Protecting children is everyone's business' and urges all Australians to 'Play Your Part'. CHOCOLATE DRIVE RAFFLE


