Dear Families.

It was wonderful to see our Prep students at school this morning. Most of them had big smiles on their faces...others were a little nervous. But by recess they were all excited to be with their friends. We look forward to welcoming back our Year 1 and 2 students on Thursday and Friday, as well as our Year 5 and 6 students on Friday after the Premier announced that they could attend school earlier.

Please remember to wear masks whenever you enter the school whether outside or when you enter the office. **Masks must be worn in the office.** If there are already three adults in the office, please wait outside until someone leaves. This way we will be able maintain appropriate social distancing. Please remember that masks are mandatory for children in Years 3-6 and highly recommended for children in Prep and 1/2.

A reminder that any child who shows any symptoms of COVID-19 must not be sent to school and should be taken to have a COVID-19 test to ensure they are negative. I cannot stress how important this is to keep **ALL** in our school community safe.

A reminder of the importance of completing the MACSSIS Survey. So far only 12 families have completed the survey. The survey is open until Thursday 28th October. Your responses are highly valued as the information we receive from the survey helps to determine the future directions of the school. If you didn't receive an email, please contact the office. We appreciate the time you take to help improve our school!

At the end of the newsletter, there is a note to be returned to school advising us if your children will not be returning to St. Paul's in 2022. Please return it to school promptly if your children are not returning next year as we are beginning to plan for 2022.
