# **ANAPHYLAXIS**

There are several children at school who suffer from allergic reactions to various forms of food, plants, bites and stings. The Australian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ASCIA) does not recommend the banning of particular items. This is based on the premise that for school age children, an essential step is to develop strategies for avoidance in the wider community as well as at school. All staff have undertaken anaphylactic training and will have it renewed this term. The school has a thorough policy, action plan and procedures for each child, including first aid response and medication storage, to ensure the wellbeing of all students. #### Learn a language on Saturday morning!

The Victorian School of Languages is a government school committed to the provision of language programs for students in years F to12 who do not have access to the study of those languages in the mainstream schools in all education sectors. The school offers over fifty languages through both faceto-face teaching in centres across the state and through distance education.

The Victorian School of Languages Area West 1 is located at: Footscray High School, Bayside P-12 College and Sunshine College and offers the following languages: Albanian, Arabic, Chin (Hakha), Croatian, Dutch, Hindi, Japanese, Macedonian, Spanish, Thai and Vietnamese.

Classes are held between 9.00 am and 12,20 pm and in order to assist with course costs a small annual contribution is appreciated: \$80.00 in Years F to 10 and \$95.00 for VCE. Adults may be accepted in VCE classes only and the annual charge is \$220.00.

# CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

## STARTING SCHOOL: THE EARLY WEEKS

Your child might need some support when school starts. Here are some simple things you can do to help these first few weeks go smoothly:

Try to drop off your child at school before the bell goes in the morning. Also pick your child up on time. If you're late it could make your child feel very anxious.

- · If your child is worried about being separated from you, look for ways to distract your child at school drop-off. For example, you could try meeting a friend at the gate or walking to school with another child and parent.
- Make after-school time a bit special, with a snack and time for vou and vour child to chat.
- · Be patient if your child wants to blurt out every little detail about school, or clams up completely. You could try saving something like, 'Tell me one good thing about your day', rather than asking a lot of questions.
- Be flexible with snacks and meals. Your child will probably be very hungry after school. If you give your child a small, healthy snack straight after school, it'll help to keep them going until dinner.
- Don't expect too much academic progress too soon. If your child is happy and seems to be enjoying school, that's a real achievement. The rest will come later.
- Remember that it's common for children to play with many different children and also to play on their own sometimes. It takes a while before they settle into a group of friends.
- If your child doesn't seem to be settling well, or tells you about teasing or <u>bullying</u>, speak to your child's classroom teacher.
