#### MATHEMATICS REPORTING

Dear Parents,

In 2025 all Catholic schools must fully implement the revised Victorian Mathematics Curriculum 2.0. The Mathematics Version 2.0 curriculum includes changes to the achievement standards used by teachers to assess and report student learning from Foundation (Prep) to Year 10.

In the past students have received three scores under the strands Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability.

Under the Mathematics Version 2.0 curriculum, teachers will report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a single, aggregated score based on assessments on all six strands: Number, Algebra, Measurement, Geometry, Statistics and Probability.

Using the learning evidence against the strands taught across the reporting cycle each semester, teachers make an on-balance and holistic judgement with reference to achievement standards that accurately reflects where the student is on the learning continuum for Mathematics Version 2.0.

#### **RECONCILIATION DAY**

On Friday we celebrated Reconciliation Day at St Paul's. We started our day with a whole school photo and used the colours that we had all come dressed in (red, yellow and black) to make the Aboriginal flag! We then welcomed Wurundjeri Elder Uncle Willi, who performed a beautiful Welcome to Country Smoking Ceremony and was amazed by all the wonderful things that we are doing here at St Paul's. We were very fortunate to also have Travis Varcoe who played over 200 AFL games for both Geelong and Collingwood, come and talk about the connection between the Aboriginal game Marn-Grook and AFL. Throughout the day, students and teachers rotated through a variety of different Aboriginal cultural activities such as Dreamtime Story Telling, Clap Stick playing and painting, native tree planting and also Yarn time with Ms Carmel in our Indigenous Garden. We ended our day by using the clap sticks that we had painted and sung the famous Yorta Yorta lullaby 'Inanay' as we walked into assembly. Overall it was a "deadly" day and we hope that everyone was able to gain a better understanding of how the Wurundjeri people have lived on and cared for this land for 1000's of years.









The St Paul's Community acknowledges the Wurundjeri people as the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we teach, learn and pray. We acknowledge the continued deep spiritual attachment and relationship that Aboriginal and Torres Strait people have to Country and pay our respects to Elders, past and present as we commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of reconciliation.
